

WORLD WAR 1 BATTLEFIELD ITINERARIES





2018 marked the centenary year to the end of World War 1 in Taita Taveta County in Kenya which pitted forces from German ruled Tanganyika against British forces protecting the British colonies in British East Africa (now Kenya & Uganda), Nyasaland (now Malawi) and the adjacent Northern Rhodesia (now Zimbabwe) and the Belgian Congo (now The DRC).

The first shot that signified the start of The World War 1 land campaign in the East African region was fired on 15th August 1914 at the border town of Taveta in Taita Taveta County, Kenya. The then Acting District Commissioner fired the shot from the then Taveta Police station (The Old British East Africa Police Station). That shot killed a German soldier named F. Broecker whose grave is in The Taveta Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) European World War 1 Cemetery.

Battlefield tourism specializes in tours of battlefields, cemeteries, memorials and related historic sites all around the world. It focuses on historic battlefields where the fighting is long past and is now strongly linked to heritage and commemoration.

Taita Hills Wildlife Sanctuary, Kenya has taken the lead in East Africa by identifying all these leads and has come up with an exciting historical journey told in pictures and an artefacts museum at Taita Hills Resort & Spa. This museum will be the start point of the “Taita Hills Wildlife Sanctuary World War 1 battlefield tours. With sites demarked around the sanctuary, there is an opportunity to learn more about the significance of these locations in relation to World War 1 in Kenya.



WW1 BATTLEFIELD SITES

Mile 27 on the Voi - Maktau Military Line

Close to Mashoti is the site of a skirmish between a coy section of the 25th Battalion Loyal North Lancashire Regiment and a group of German saboteurs where they engaged in close hand to hand combat resulting in fatalities on both sides.

Mashoti Fort

Built by the Loyal North Lancashire Regt in late 1915, trenches and regulation designed British Fort laid out according to the 'book'. Today, it is eroded but remnants are still visible and easily accessible for viewing.

Maktau

A dusty sleepy little village today. In 1915 it accommodated over 20,000 Empire troops and the first airfield in East Africa. Unfortunately nothing remains of the important role the area played.

Nearby is Pequet Hill with remains of dry stone wall fortifications with magnificent views over the Plains of Tsavo National Park and Mt. Kilimanjaro in the distance.

One can often drive close to the top followed by a short walk to the fort. Maktau Railway Station on the now abandoned military line between Voi and Taveta is an interesting visit to view the railway lines and few signals that still remain.

Maktau Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) Indian WW1 Memorial

CWGC Memorial commemorates the Indian soldiers who were killed defending General Malleon during an ambush by the German forces. It originally had British casualties who were re-interred at Voi.

Snipers Baobab Tree

Legend has it that a German woman was camped in this magnificent hollow Baobab Tree, targeting British troops as they tried to attack Salaita Hill.



A Royal Navy Air Service No 4 Expeditionary Sqd Caudron GIII with its 89hp Gnome engine gaining revs prior to take off from Maktau as ground crew hang on until the pilot signals them to release the craft. Max speed was about 60mph.



Carrier Corps Porters were used through out the East African Campaign



Voi Railway Station Nov 1914. Note the large number of straw bales of fodder that was needed to feed the oxen, horses, mules and other livestock on the front at Maktau.



In late 1915 motorised transport arrived in East Africa. These Model T Fords never superseded the use of porters who did not need made up roads and tracks.

Salaita Hill

Described by the British Commanders as the “cork in the bottle” that had to be taken out before the contents of German East Africa were revealed. Strategically located between the Pare Mountains in the South and Mt. Kilimanjaro in the west. Salaita was quickly occupied and made into a strong defensive position by the Germans in 1914. The hill was attacked thrice by the British who were beaten off with heavy loss each time.

Mahoo Area

A Church Missionary Society mission post that was occupied by the Germans in September 1914 and subsequently fortified by them. Several well preserved trenches can still be seen here.

Taveta Common Wealth War Graves Commission (CWGC)

European WW1 Cemetery Mainly holds the dead from the various attacks made on Salaita and the surrounding area and also from the battle at Latema & Reata Ridges. Also has the dead from the German war. On a Battlefield Tour, ceremonial wreaths may be placed on the Cross of Sacrifice.

Former Taveta Police Station (The Old

British East Africa Police Station) In desperate need of restoration. It was from this building that the first shots of the land campaign were fired from, signaling the start of the East African Campaign.

Taveta Common Wealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) Indian WW1 Cemetery

A memorial to 29 Indian soldiers killed in the area during the East African Campaign.

Voi Commonwealth War Graves Commission WW1 Cemetery

A consolidated cemetery with graves recovered from scattered burial places, after the war and re-interred here. Lt. Dartnell VC is buried here.

ITINERARY NOTES

- On the first evening on Safari a 30 minute multimedia presentation will be aired before dinner.
- Every evening, there will be discussions on the day's events and a brief on the following day's activities.
- During the battlefield excursions, there will be time to view and photograph the wild life, bird life, flora and fauna of the eco-system not only from the vehicles but also whilst walking to the various sites. An armed Kenya Wildlife department ranger will accompany all groups where relevant.
- Strong walking shoes or good runners / trainers are necessary. Taita Hills Safari Resort & Spa has a swimming pool to cool off after a hot day out on excursions.
- Pre travel reading on the destination and WW1 history is recommended in order to get a better feel and appreciation for the campaign as it unfolds. These are the most recent books on the campaign. Some are however out of print.


